


How to Find Free Books on iPad and iPhone

- 3. Tap on **the Search tab** from the bottom menu.





- 5. Tap on a **book** and then tap the **GET** button.




Once the book is downloaded, you can access the same from the Library section of Books app.

Tap on ${\bf Library} o {\bf Collections} o {\bf Downloaded}.$ There you go!





Although not all the books are for free in Kindle, this immensely popular Amazon book reader has a massive library of free eBooks.



Libby is a free app that combines online and offline book reading experiences. Once you


download the app, you need to register your local library card on Libby. Alternatively, Libby would help you find a local library, where you have a membership.

There are 80 million writers and readers connected to this global platform called Wattpad. By downloading this app, you become a part of this thriving community.


Apart from reading stories, you can share your own original story on Wattpad. Members of this app will encourage you throughout your writing journey.

The app offers more than 75000 free titles.


You can purchase on the official Barnes & Noble website and read that title on your iOS device. Apart from books, the app provides magazines and comics.

On your Apple devices, you can start reading a book and then resume from the same page on another device. The app will remember where you left off.



1. Project Gutenberg




This is a name to reckon with free books. It is your online library of more than 60000 free books to read. For students of literature, it is a treasure trove as this website stores books mostly published before 1924.

2. Digital Libraries





The website has collected more than 20 million records from people and organizations. And they keep adding more to the list.


All the books are categorized in different subjects like art, fantasy, biographies, recipes, music, medicine, history, etc. Alternatively, you can search a book by its title, author, or text.
