

When activated on your <u>Apple Intelligence supported devices</u>, this feature analyzes the entire webpage and identifies key points, important data, and essential takeaways. Once done, it briefly summarizes the page that captures the core message of the entire content.

This helps you quickly understand the crux of the content without needing to go through the entire webpage yourself. You can then copy the summary text like you usually do or use the Apple Intelligence Writing Tools to change it.

Benefits of summarizing webpages with Apple Intelligence


While the Summarize feature greatly benefits those who read a lot, it also has a series of other benefits. Let's look at a few.


- Saves time: A quick summary of large text blocks can help busy professionals, students, or anyone looking to comprehend large amounts of information in less time.

How to summarize webpages in Safari in iOS 18

Before you begin, make sure your iPhone is <u>updated to the latest iOS 18 beta</u> and supports Apple Intelligence. Then, follow these steps:


- 1. Open Safari and go to the webpage you want to summarize.
- 2. Tap the **Reader** mode icon in the address bar.
- 3. Tap the **Show Reader** button on the overlay menu that appears.






- 4. Next, tap the **Summarize** button in the reader view interface.
- 5. Once Apple Intelligence goes through the entire text, the webpage Summary will

appear below the page title.



6. To exit the Reader mode, tap the **Reader** icon in the URL tab, then tap the **Hide Reader** button.






How to summarize webpages in Safari in macOS Sequoia


Ensure your Mac is running on macOS Sequoia and supports Apple Intelligence. After this,

follow these instructions:


- 1. Go to the webpage you want to summarize in Safari.
- 2. Click the **Reader** mode icon in the left corner of the address bar.
- 3. Then, click the **Show Reader** button on the pop-up menu that appears.



4. Next, click the **Summarize** button below the webpage title and wait for Apple Intelligence to go through the entire webpage and generate a summary.



Once generated, you will see the summary on the right.



Process more information in less time....

The introduction of the Summarize webpages feature represents Apple's significant step towards integrating Apple Intelligence into our day-to-day tasks on iPhones and Macs.

As someone who reads a lot, I have been using the feature for quite a while now and am fully content with its results. However, I feel that Apple has messed up big time by hiding the feature behind the Reader mode, as Summarize being available in plain sight would be more beneficial.
