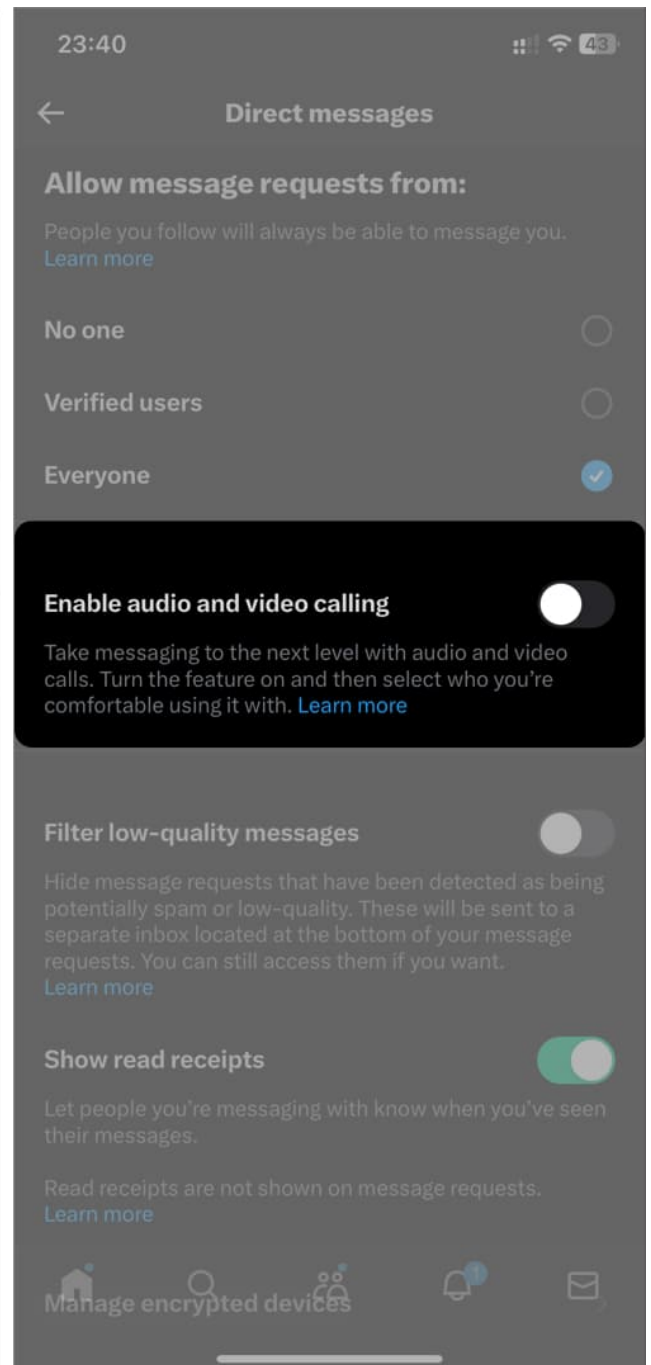
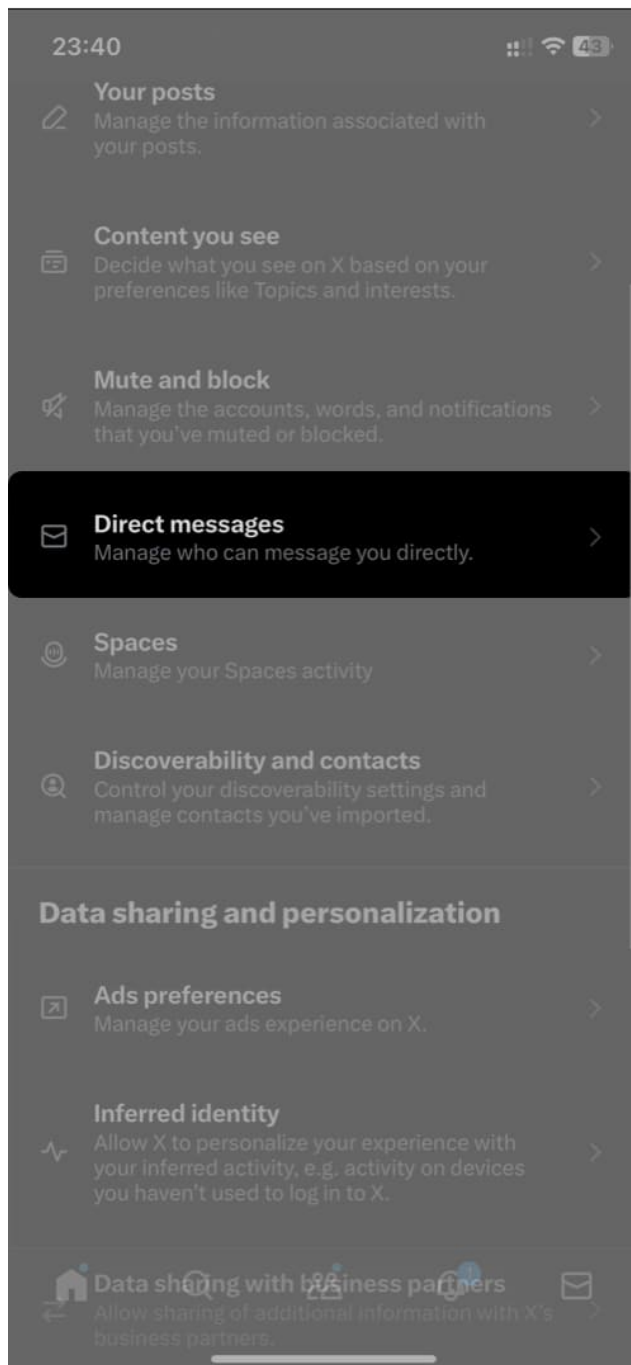


How to disable audio and video calls in X on iPhone

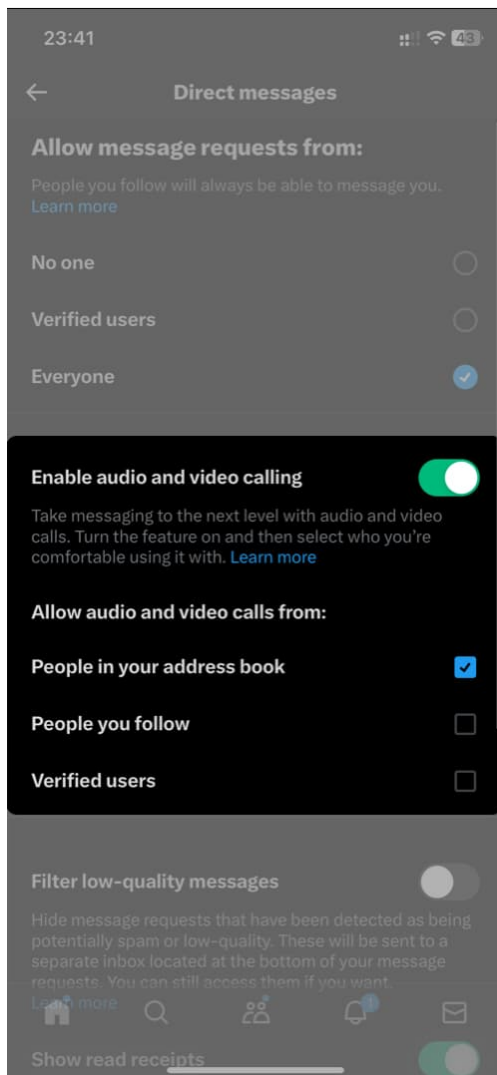
1. Open the **X app** on your iPhone → Tap your **profile icon** at the top-left.
2. Go to **Settings and Support** → **Settings and privacy** → **Privacy and safety**.



3. Tap **Direct messages**.
4. Toggle off **Enable audio and video calling**.



- If you'd like to keep the call feature on but limit it to a category of users, keep the **Enable audio and video calling** switch on.
- Then tap the appropriate check boxes under **Allow audio and video calls from** the section to filter your call preferences.



It's as simple as that!

Although X limits the ability to place calls to [Twitter Blue](#) users, anyone can receive a call regardless of their account type. Despite this limitation, people can go to any length to troll others on X. Some desperate abusers won't mind investing in a premium account to lash at you via a call. So it's better to play safe and block potential abusers from getting their voices in on you.
