

How to connect Samsung Galaxy watch to iPhone

Compatibility:

- Samsung Galaxy Watch 3
- Galaxy watch
- Galaxy watch Active
- Galaxy Watch Active2
- Gear S2, Gear S3, Gear Sport
- Gear Live, Gear Fit 2, Gear Fit2 Pro
- Galaxy Fit

1. Download the [Galaxy Wearable](#) app from the iOS App Store.
2. Open the app, tap **Start the Journey**, then select Galaxy Watch.
3. Once it's found your Galaxy Watch, tap **Connect**. When the request appears, tap **Pair**.
If your Galaxy Watch doesn't show up on your phone, check Bluetooth is on the Galaxy Watch and that it's not connected to any other phones.



4. Review and tap **Agree** to terms and conditions, then tap **Done**.


5. Once the Galaxy Watch is connected to the Galaxy Wearable app.


How to pair Fitbit to your iPhone

Compatibility: Every FitBit smartwatch is compatible with iOS 14 and above

1. Open [Fitbit App](#) on your iPhone.
2. Tap **Join Fitbit**.
3. Scroll through the list, and tap on the **Fitbit device** you have.



4. Tap **Set Up**.
5. Sign into your Fitbit **account**.
(Create one if you don't have)
6. Tap **Next**.
7. Fitbit's **Privacy Policy** will pop up. Hit, I agree.
8. And you are all set to use your FitBit with your iPhone.



Note: You might need to opt-in to Fitbit's premium subscription to keep using the app.

Set up and use Fossil smartwatch with iPhone

Compatibility:

- Fossil Hybrid
- Fossil Hybrid HR
- Fossil Gen 4
- Fossil Gen 5

1. Download the [Wear OS](#) app from the App Store.
2. Tap **“allow”** to give you phone access to your smartwatch.
3. Select your preferred language.
4. Select the name of your smartwatch.
5. Tap **“pair”** to connect your smartwatch to your iPhone via Bluetooth.

6. The app will send a notification on your watch once connected.
7. Now, wait till it gets synced to the iPhone.
8. Allow your smartwatch to display notifications sent from your iPhone.

If you have a Fossil hybrid smartwatch, you will need the [Fossil smartwatch](#) app from the app store and follow these instructions.

How to connect Amazfit smartwatch to an iPhone

Compatibility:

- Amazfit GTS
- Amazfit GTS 3
- Amazfit GTS 2e
- Amazfit GTS 2
- Amazfit GTR Series

1. Install the [Amazfit Zepp](#) App and create an account.
2. Long-press the physical button on the right side of the watch for 6 seconds and release it to turn on your watch. It will display a QR code on the screen of the watch.
3. Open Amazfit App and log in to your user account.
4. Select the device to be paired with.



5. Scan the **QR code** displayed on the watch screen to pair with your iPhone.



6. Tap to confirm for Bluetooth connection.
7. After confirmation, your watch will connect to your iPhone immediately.

Note: If the given steps do not work, then either restart your smartwatch once or reset your smartwatch and try mentioned steps again.

Wrapping Up

Just like that, you can connect most smartwatches like that. As mentioned above, I have tried to cover most mainstream smartwatches. But if you have a watch that's not on the list and need help connecting it to your iPhone, feel free to shoot us the task in the comment section.
