- To access Signal Desktop, you must have;
  - Windows 64-bit: 7, 8, 8.1, and 10.
  - $\circ\,$  macOS 10.10 and above.

## How to set up Signal on Mac or Windows PC

1. Open the desktop app, and the first thing you'll see is a **QR code**.



- 2. Open the Signal app on your phone and tap your profile at the **top left** to access the **Settings**.
- 3. Select Linked Devices.
- 4. Tap Link New Device.



5. Hold your phone in front of your computer to scan the **QR** code on the desktop app.

*Note:* If you are prompted, you might need to give Signal permission to use your camera to scan the QR code.

- 7. On your desktop, set a **name for the computer** you have linked.
- 8. Now, wait until your contacts and groups are **synced**.

Once the setup is complete, you can chat from the Signal app on your desktop, and it will sync automatically with your mobile device.

- 1. On your phone, tap the **Settings** and go to **Linked Devices**.
- 2. In Linked Devices, tap **Edit** at the top right.



- 3. Tap the  **icon** next to the device you want to unlink.
- 4. Tap **Unlink** and then again tap **Unlink** in the confirmation dialog box.
